

Inspectors award school top marks

A SCHOOL was given 'excellent' and 'outstanding' marks by inspectors.

Ysgol Gymuned Cwm y Glo, its 65 children and 12 staff were praised for the leadership and self-evaluation systems.

Inspectors noted the school's anti-bullying policies and the

maturity and social responsibility of its pupils were excellent.

They reported that the parents were unanimous in their praise for the school and the part it plays in their children's lives.

There was praise for the role of the governors and the community in the school's life,

and the natural bilingualism, the respect that the parents and children have for the Welsh and English languages.

Governors chairman Cllr Brian Jones, said: "The school has come a long way in a short time under the outstanding leadership and clear vision of headteacher Garem Jackson."
